#### **Lakers-Thunder Playoff Notes:**

The OKC Franchise is 11-24 all-time in the playoffs versus the Los Angeles Lakers. Prior to the 2010 playoffs, the two teams last met in postseason play during the 1998 Western Conference Semifinals (Lakers won series 4-1). In all, the two organizations have squared-off in seven postseason series (Lakers lead all time playoff series 5-2). Overall, the Lakers are 9-9 on the road in postseason play vs. the OKC franchise.

#### **April 27, 2010 at STAPLES Center**

##### ***Los Angeles 111 – Los Angeles 87***

The Los Angeles Lakers wasted little time scoring the games first 10 points as the defending NBA champs went on to win a lopsided affair in game five of the best-of-seven first-round Western Conference playoff series...Oklahoma City struggled to convert offensively in the first two periods (missed first 13 shots of the game) while the Lakers had little difficulty scoring both early and often. At halftime, OKC was limited to 34 points on 26.2% shooting (11-42 FGs), while LAL converted 64.9% (24-37 FGs) of their field goal attempts before jumping out to a 21-point lead after two quarters of play...Los Angeles controlled the paint from start to finish – outscoring the Thunder 58-26 in the key...Pau Gasol (game-high 25 points; 11 rebounds) and Andrew Bynum (21 points; 11 rebounds) each recorded double-doubles for Los Angeles...After scoring 47 fast break points during games three and four, OKC was limited to just seven points in transition during game five at STAPLES Center...The Oklahoma City starters shot just 29.2% from the field and were outscored on the night by the Lakers' starters 79-47...Thunder rookie Serge Ibaka continued his strong play by registering 12 points to go along with a team-high nine rebounds in 28 minutes of action...Meanwhile, Kevin Durant scored a team-high 17 points, but he was limited to 5-of-14 shooting.

#### **April 24, 2010 at Ford Center**

##### ***Oklahoma City 110 – Los Angeles 89***

During OKC's wire-to-wire victory at the Ford Center, the Thunder led by as many as 29 points (105-76) in the fourth quarter before going onto tie the best-of-seven series (2-2) vs. Los Angeles. The 21 point margin of victory is tied for the fifth largest for a No. 8 seed over a No. 1 seed...After getting off to slow starts in the first three games of the series, OKC held LAL to 36.4% shooting (8-22 FGs) in the first quarter as the Thunder outscored the Lakers 29-17 in the opening period...Kevin Durant who did not play in the fourth quarter, led all scorers with 22 points on 6-of-12 shooting...OKC outrebounded LAL by a 50-43 margin. In the series, the team to own the rebounding edge is 4-0...OKC limited the Lakers' Kobe Bryant to just 12 points in 32 minutes of action...Thunder rookies James Harden and Eric Maynor came off the bench to combine for 28 points on 6-11 FGs...The Thunder outscored the Lakers 24-2 in fast break opportunities (OKC outscored LAL in transition 47-9 in the last two games)...Russell Westbrook, the games second leading scorer registered 18 points (6-11 FGs) to go along with eight rebounds and six assists. In 29 minutes, Westbrook failed to commit a single turnover (OKC was 5-1 during the regular season when Westbrook committed zero turnovers)...LAL shot 60.7% from the free throw line (17-28 FTs) while OKC shot 87.5% from the charity stripe (42-48 FTs).

#### **April 22, 2010 at Ford Center**

##### ***Oklahoma City 101 – Los Angeles 96***

In the first-ever home playoff game in Oklahoma City history, Kevin Durant recorded his first career postseason double-double (29 points; 19 rebounds) to help lead OKC past Los Angeles...After shooting just 32.5% (13-40 FGs) in the first half, the Thunder responded in the second half by outscoring the Lakers 58-46 in the final two periods thanks to 50.0% shooting (20-40 FGs)...After trailing by 11 points (53-64) at the 5:51 mark of the third quarter, OKC outscored LAL 21-10 in the next five minutes to tie the score at 74 apiece...The duo of Russell Westbrook (27 points, eight rebounds and four assists) and Durant outscored the entire Lakers team (22-21) in the final period to secure the OKC win. Including Durant's step-back 18-foot jump shot at the 4:27 mark of the fourth quarter to put OKC ahead 90-82, Westbrook and Durant converted 8-of-13 field goals in the final period...On the night, the Thunder outrebounded Los Angeles by a 53-39 margin (OKC 16-2 during regular season when outrebounding opponent by 10+)...OKC outscored LAL 23-7 in fast break opportunities...Thunder rookie James Harden connected on three of his four 3-point field goals and led all reserves by scoring 15 of his 18 points in the first half... The two teams played in front of 18,342; the largest crowd at the Ford Center this year...Bryant led all LAL scorers with 24 points, but he was limited to 5-of-17 shooting in the second half.

**April 20, 2010 at STAPLES Center**  
***Los Angeles 95 – Oklahoma City 92***

Kobe Bryant scored 15 of his game-high 39 points (12-28 FGs) in the fourth quarter as the Los Angeles Lakers held off the Thunder in game #2 of the best-of-seven series at STAPLES Center...In a game that featured 12 lead changes and 14 ties, OKC pulled-ahead 88-86 at the 2:49 mark of the fourth quarter after two made Russell Westbrook free throws. Bryant would respond by scoring six unanswered points to give LAL a 92-88 advantage. Kevin Durant, who finished the night with a team-high 32 points (12-26 FGs) failed to convert a 24-foot 3-point field goal which would have put OKC ahead by one with 15 seconds remaining. On the final Thunder possession, Jeff Green missed what would have been a game-tying 3-point field goal just before time expired...The Thunder set an all-time franchise playoff record for most blocked shot (17) thanks to a season-best seven blocks from OKC rookie Serge Ibaka...OKC trailed by as many as 11 early in the first half after shooting just 28.6% in the first quarter (6-21 FGs), before outscoring the Lakers 29-19 in the second period to take a 47-45 halftime lead...The Thunder was outrebounded by a 49-37 margin. During the regular season, OKC was winless when outrebounded by 10 or more (0-5).

**April 18, 2010 at STAPLES Center**  
***Los Angeles 87 – Oklahoma City 79***

The Lakers outscored the Thunder 27-13 in the first period as Oklahoma City was limited to 26.3% shooting (5-19 FGs) in the first 12 minutes of play as Los Angeles captured game one in the best-of-seven first round playoff series...OKC would respond by outscoring LAL 66-60 in the second through fourth quarters. Russell Westbrook tallied 23 points on 10-of-16 field goals to go along with eight assists to help lead the Thunder. After trailing by as many as 17 points in the first half, Westbrook scored eight straight points for the Thunder to close the second period and help pull OKC to within eight points of LAL (39-47) at halftime...The NBA's regular season scoring champ, Kevin Durant finished with a game-high 24 points, but was limited to 7-of-24 shooting in his first career playoff contest...OKC outscored LAL 14-2 in fast break opportunities...The Lakers frontcourt of Bynum (13 points; 12 rebounds) and Gasol (19 points; 13 rebounds) each recorded doubles-doubles for Los Angeles...The OKC franchise has now lost 11 consecutive playoff games on the Lakers home court {third longest active playoff streak (Longest: Trail Blazers defeated Jazz in 14 consecutive)}.

### November 3, 2009 at Ford Center

#### **Los Angeles Lakers 101 – Oklahoma City 98 (OT)**

In a game that featured 16 lead changes and seven ties, the Thunder took the defending NBA Champions to overtime before being outscored 11-8 in the extra session...LAL scored nine unanswered points to open the game on 70.6% first quarter shooting...The Thunder trailed by as many as 13 in the first half before using a 24-10 first half run to pull within a single point after two quarters of play...Thabo Sefolosha posted a season-high four steals as OKC forced 26 LAL turnovers (23 pts off TO's)...Los Angeles had not committed 26+ turnovers since March 25, 2007 (26 TO's vs. GSW).

### November 22, 2009 at STAPLES Center

#### **Los Angeles Lakers 101 – Oklahoma City 85**

OKC rookie Serge Ibaka recorded his first career double-double thanks to 11 points and a game-high 13 rebounds...In addition, Ibaka set a career-high with five blocked shots as the Thunder team blocked a total of 16 shots (most in an NBA game this season)...OKC surrendered an opponent season-high 35 first quarter points thanks to a running 15-foot, left-handed jump shot from Bryant as time expired to end the first period...Shannon Brown's alley-oop dunk midway through the fourth quarter gave the Lakers a 28-point advantage (largest of the game)... OKC was held to a season low 34 first half points on just 12-of-38 shooting (31.6%). Despite setting a season-high with 51 rebounds, OKC was outscored in the paint by a 60-44 margin.

### December 22, 2009 at STAPLES Center

#### **Los Angeles Lakers 111 – Oklahoma City 108**

After trailing by as many as 11 points in the fourth quarter, OKC used a 18-7 run to trim the LAL lead to a single point (109-108) with 15.4 seconds remaining...Russell Westbrook had the opportunity to tie the contest in the final seconds, but his 25-foot three-point jump-shot came up just short as the Thunder fell to the defending NBA Champions at STAPLES Center...Serge Ibaka pulled-down a career-high 14 rebounds to go along with eight points in 28 minutes of action. Kobe Bryant led the Lakers with a game-high 40 points 14-26 FG's...OKC lost for the first time this season when scoring 100+ points (11-0 heading into the game).

### March 26, 2010 at Ford Center

#### **Oklahoma City 91-Los Angeles Lakers 75**

Oklahoma City snapped the Lakers seven-game winning streak while holding the defending NBA-Champs to a season-low 75 points on 39.2% shooting (29-74 FGs). Prior to the win, OKC had lost 12 straight contests versus Los Angeles. The last OKC franchise victory over the Lakers came on 11/5/2006...During the wire-to-wire victory Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook combined for 47 points through three quarters to match the entire scoring output of Los Angeles. After leading 53-34 at halftime, OKC extended their lead to 33 points (80-47) at the end of the third period...Kobe Bryant did not play in the fourth quarter and was limited to 11 points on 4-of-11 FGs. On the evening Bryant committed half of Los Angeles' 18 turnovers (led to 21 Thunder points). Meanwhile, OKC turned the ball over 14 times (led to 10 LAL points). At the time, OKC was 27-13 when committing 15 turnovers or fewer...OKC limited LAL to 39.2% shooting on the night (OKC went 10-2 this season when holding the opposition to sub 40.0% FG shooting)...Nenad Krstic posted his 3rd double-double of the season with a game-high 10 rebounds to go along with 10 points on 4-5 FGs. OKC finished the season 27-3 when Krstic scores in double-figures.

## OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES (REGULAR SEASON)

**And the Thunder Rolls:** The Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season by compiling 50 wins a year after posting 23 victories during the team's inaugural season in Oklahoma City. The 27 win improvement is the tied for the NINTH largest increase in NBA history. Additionally, the Thunder is just the eleventh team in the last 10 years to double their win total from one season to the next (Most recently: Miami Heat won 43 in 2008-09 after 15 wins in 2007-08). With their win over the Memphis Grizzlies in the team's regular season finale (4/14), Oklahoma City maintains a 26-11 record (.703) dating back to January 29th. The .703 winning percentage during this span was tied for 6th best in the NBA. During this 10 week long stretch, the Thunder averaged 105.8 points per game on better than 47.0% shooting.

**That's Improvement:** After finishing with a record of 23-59 (.280) a season ago, Oklahoma City demonstrated material improvement this past year by posting a record of 50-32 (.610), which represents a 33.0% improvement in winning percentage year-over-year. The 33.0% improvement leads the NBA this season (Memphis ranks second with a 19.5% year-over-year improvement).

**Youngest Scoring Champ...EVER:** With a game-high 31 points during the Thunder's regular season finale (4/14), Kevin Durant (30.1 ppg) locked-up the NBA's scoring title in just his third season removed from the university of Texas. By averaging 36.3 points during the final seven games of the season, KD moved past LeBron James (29.7 ppg) and in doing so he becomes the youngest scoring champion in NBA history (21 years and 197 days). The previous record was held by Max Zaslofsky of the Chicago Stags (22 years and 105 days) in 1947-48, when the scoring champion was determined by total points scored. Durant also becomes the first player in OKC franchise history to capture a regular season scoring title.

**Rarified Air:** Durant became just the 10<sup>th</sup> player in NBA history to start every game during the regular season while averaging 30 points or better. Only Michael Jordan (five times) and Wilt Chamberlain (four times) accomplished this feat more than once. Kobe Bryant was the last NBA player to play in every game while scoring at a 30.0 point per game clip (2002-03).

**Chart Topper:** With his 36<sup>th</sup> point during OKC's win over Minnesota on 4/4, KD passed Dale Ellis for the all time single season scoring title with his 2,254<sup>th</sup> point of the year. At the end of March, Durant reached the 2,000 point plateau with his three-point field goal at the 3:39 mark of the third quarter during the Thunder's loss to the Indiana Pacers on 3/21. KD reached the 2,000 point threshold in just his 68<sup>th</sup> game of the season and in doing so he becomes one of only two NBA players to accomplish the feat at age 21 or younger. LeBron James reached the 2,000-point scored plateau in his 65<sup>th</sup> game during the 2005-06 season at the age of 21.

**Starters Intact:** This season, four Oklahoma City players started all 82 games for the Thunder (Durant, Green, Sefolsha and Westbrook). To highlight the rarity of such a feat, only four teams dating back to 1970 have maintained the same four starters in every game played during the regular season {Most Recent: The 2002-03 Golden State Warriors (Arenas, Dampier, Jamison and Richardson)}.

**Making them Look Free:** Kevin Durant finished the season ranked 6th in the NBA by shooting an even 90.0% from the charity stripe. Durant's 756 free throw makes are an all-time OKC Thunder franchise record and the most in a single-season since Michael Jordan recorded 833 free throw makes during the 1986-87 season. With his five made free throws during the Thunder's regular season finale, KD passed Rick Barry and moved into 6th place all-time for free throws made in a season. KD is the ONLY player in NBA history to convert 700+ free throws while shooting 90.0% or better. Durant's 10.2 free throw attempts per game this past season led the NBA

**Youth Movement:** The Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season as the youngest team in the NBA with an average age of 25 years and 42 days. Additionally, the OKC starting lineup of Durant, Green, Krstic, Sefolsha and Westbrook is the youngest in the league with an average age of 23 years and 346 days. For a matter of comparison, the age of the average NBA roster is 26 years and 329 days and the oldest team in the league entering the 2009-10 season was the San Antonio Spurs with an average age of 29 years and 73 days (as of opening night).

**Russell Rules:** After recording double-figure assist totals nine times during his rookie season (2008-09), Russell Westbrook tallied 28 double-figure assist games (24 double-doubles on the season). During a two week span from 2/20-3/3, Westbrook recorded double-doubles in six of seven Thunder Contests. Included in that stretch, Westbrook registered his second career triple-double 2/21 at Minnesota where he finished the night with 22 points to go along with 10 rebounds and 14 assists. Westbrook, finished the season tied for 7<sup>th</sup> in the NBA with 8.0 assists per game. Earlier this season, Westbrook recorded double-figure assist totals in four straight contests (12/28 – 1/2). The last OKC franchise player to record such a feat was Gary Payton who handed-out 10-plus assists in four consecutive games during the 2001-02 season (1/3/02 – 1/10/02). Oklahoma City went 23-5 this past season when Westbrook recorded 10+ assists.

**Boards are the Barometer:** The Thunder finished the regular season ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> in the NBA in rebounding. To dig a bit deeper, the Thunder outrebounded their opponent in 55 of 82 games. In those contests, OKC posted a 40-15 record. Meanwhile, the Thunder went just 10-17 when they fail to outrebound their opposition. During a three-game stretch to close-out calendar year 2009 (12/23 at PHX – 12/28 at NJ), OKC outrebounded their opponent by 10 or more in each of the three straight contests. It had been four years since the OKC franchise last outrebounded their opponent by 10+ in three consecutive games (12/23/05 – 12/29/05). On the season, the Thunder went 16-2 when outrebounding their opponent by 10 or more.

**Road Warriors:** With their victory over the Minnesota Timberwolves (2/21), the Thunder won five consecutive roads games for the first time since February of 2005. This season, the Thunder pieced together three separate three-game road winning streaks. As a point of reference, the OKC franchise failed to win three straight road contests in each of the last two seasons. Despite their loss to the Blazers at the Rose Garden (4/13), OKC finished the 2009-10 season with a 23-18 record away from the Ford Center. The 23 road wins exceeds the combined road win total for the past two seasons (15). The Thunder was one of ELEVEN teams in the NBA to boast a winning road record this season and only FIVE teams registered more road victories than OKC (BOS, CLE, ORL, DAL & POR).

**30 Never Looked so Good:** By recorded a game-high 30 points during the Thunder's season finale versus Memphis, Kevin Durant registered his 47<sup>th</sup> 30-plus scoring game of the season. The 47 games of 30+ points were the MOST in the NBA this year and an OKC franchise record. Most importantly, the Thunder went 31-16 when Durant scored 30+. Earlier this year, Durant set an all-time franchise record by scoring 30+ points in SEVEN consecutive contests (12/22 – 1/2). Durant would later match his own franchise record by scoring 30+ in the final seven games of the regular season. In doing so he was awarded NBA Western Conference Player of the Month honors after averaging a league-leading 34.6 points during the month of April. LeBron James was the last NBA player to piece together a seven-game string of 30+ (Nov. 2007).

**A Run for the Record-Books:** In a streak that spanned 64 days, Kevin Durant became the ONLY active NBA player to score 25 or more points in 29 consecutive games. The streak which began 12/22 at LAL came to an end on 2/24 when Durant recorded a team-high 21 points in the Thunder's loss to San Antonio. During the 29-game run, the Thunder posted a record of 20-9 as KD averaged 32.4 points on 50.8% shooting including 50.0% (51-102) from behind the three-point arc. Ray Allen held the previous franchise mark by recording 25-plus in ten straight games during the 2006-07 season. Michael Jordan was the last player to exceed KD's streak when he recorded 25+ points in 40 straight games during the 1986-87 season.

**Winning with D:** During the 2009-10 season, the Thunder allowed 98.0 points per game (allowed 103.1 points per game last season) which ranked 11<sup>th</sup> best in the NBA. On the year, The Thunder held their opponent to 90 points or fewer on 21 separate occasions (19-2 record). Oklahoma City also ranked 7<sup>th</sup> in opponent field goal percentage as the Thunder allow their opposition to shoot 44.8%. Lastly, defense quickly became the trademark during Thunder victories this past season. In the 50 Thunder wins (SAC, DET, ORL, LAC, SA, MIA, WAS, UTA, MIL, PHI, GS, MEM, DET, PHX, CHA, NJ, WAS, UTA, CHI, IND, NY, MIA, ATL, MIN, DEN, GS, ATL, NO, GS, POR, DAL, NY, MIN, TOR, SAC, LAC, SAC, NO, NJ, UTA, TOR, HOU, LAL, PHI, BOS, DAL, MIN, PHX and MEM), OKC allowed only 94.8 points per game on 43.8% shooting.

**Much Improved:** In his second NBA season, Thunder guard Russell Westbrook exhibited an improved all-around game. During his 82 appearances, Westbrook averaged 16.1 points, 8.0 assists and 4.9 rebounds in 34.3 minutes per game. Only a select number of NBA players have maintained such averages throughout the course of an entire season. Below is a list of those second-year players to average 16-plus points, 6-plus assists and 4-plus rebounds during their sophomore NBA seasons.

**All Good Things Must Come to an End:** With their loss to the Phoenix Suns on 2/23, the Thunder fell victim to a loss for the first time in nearly a month (1/27 vs. Chicago). The Thunder loss snapped a run of nine straight Oklahoma City victories. The nine consecutive wins is the longest streak for the OKC franchise since the team won nine games in a row after losing its season opener to begin the 2004-05 season (11/5/04 – 11/19/04). Additionally, the nine-game streak at the time was the longest win streak in the NBA at the time. During the nine game undefeated stretch, the Thunder shot 47.5% from the floor while outscoring the opposition by a 104.9 to 96.6 margin.

**Perfection from the Stripe:** During OKC's loss to the Sacramento Kings (11/10), Kevin Durant recorded a game-high 37 points in large part due to his efficiency from the charity stripe. Durant set a franchise record by converting 18 made free throws without a miss (also a NBA season-high). Setting all-time franchise records from the free throw line is not unfamiliar to Durant. Last season versus the Los Angeles Clippers (1/23/09), KD converted 24 made free throws (on 26 attempts) en route to a 46-point performance at STAPLES Center. Durant's 24 made free throws set a Thunder franchise record. In addition, Durant set a NBA season-high for most FT's made during the 2008-09 season. In doing so, Durant became one of only four players over the last 20 years to convert 24+ FT's in a single game (MR; LeBron James: 24-of-28 on 3/12/06).

**Century Mark:** On December 2<sup>nd</sup> versus the Philadelphia 76ers, Thunder guard Russell Westbrook notched his 100<sup>th</sup> career game in memorable fashion. In 34 minutes played vs. Philly, Westbrook recorded a season-high 15 assists, marking the 14<sup>th</sup> time in his career in which he has reached double-figure assist totals. By posting 11 double-doubles (points and assists) through his first 100 career contests, Westbrook becomes one-of-twelve active players to have accomplished the feat. He joins the likes of Jason Kidd, Chris Paul, Allen Iverson and Deron Williams by posting 11-plus double-doubles comprised of points and assists through his first 100 career games played.

**Talking Turnovers:** During OKC's game at Milwaukee (1/2), Thunder guard Russell Westbrook handed-out 13 assists without committing a single turnover. With ZERO turnovers against the Bucks, he recorded the most assists (13) without a turnover (in franchise history) since April 8, 2001 (Gary Payton; 15 assists, 0 TO's). Additionally, it is the most assists without a turnover in the NBA in nearly a year (Chris Paul 15 assists, zero turnovers; 1/6/09). With his zero-turnover performance in the Thunder's win vs. NY (1/11), Westbrook failed to commit a single turnover in six games this season (5-1 OKC record). As a team, the Oklahoma City Thunder committed 14 or fewer turnovers in EIGHT consecutive games to close 2009 (12/16 – 12/29). On the year, OKC is 33-14 when committing 15 or fewer turnovers.
