GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- With the win, OKC captured their 46th victory of the season, thereby doubling the team's win total from all of last year. Additionally, OKC won on the second night of a back-to-back for their fourth "sweep" of a B-2-B this season.
- The Thunder won despite allowing BOS to shoot an opponent season-best 59.9% (44-74 FGs) including 71.1% (27-38 FGs) in the first half.
- After trailing 100-101 at the 2:56 mark of the fourth quarter, Jeff Green sparked the Thunder by connecting on two three-point field goals in the final two minutes as OKC outscored BOS 9-3 to close the contest.
- Durant scored 20 of his game-high 37 points (10-20 FGs) in the second half. On the night, KD converted all 15 of his free throw attempts.
- The game featured 25 lead changes and 12 ties. No team would lead by more than seven points.
- OKC was outscored 27-38 in the second quarter as BOS shot 85.0% (17-20 FGs) in the period. The 38 points in the quarter are the most by an OKC opponent this season.
- Russell Westbrook recorded his 23rd double-double of the season with 21 points to go along with 10 assists.
- With the win, OKC concludes their schedule vs. Eastern Conference opponents by finishing with a 22-8 record. On the season, the Thunder "swept" EIGHT Eastern Conference opponents while defeating 14-of-15 teams in the conference (0-2 vs. Cleveland).

GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- OKC improved to a perfect 6-0 this season when six or more players score in double-figures as the Thunder built a 25 point second half lead before "sweeping" the season series versus the 76ers.
- After leading 84-74 after three quarters of play, Oklahoma City opened the fourth quarter on 12-2 run during the first five-plus minutes of the period to put the game out of reach for PHI.
- Russell Westbrook came one assist shy of his career-high as he registered 10 points and 14 assists for his 22nd double-double of the season.
- Nenad Krstic tallied 14 points on 7-of-12 shooting in just 23 minutes of action. On the season, Oklahoma City is 26-3 when Krstic scores in double-figures.
- The Thunder outrebounded Philly by a 47-36 margin. On the year the Thunder is 37-14 when outrebounding their opponent and 15-1 when outrebounding the opposition by 10 or more.
- Thunder rookies James Harden and Serge Ibaka both came off the bench to score in double figures as the duo combined for 22 points on 10-of-13 from the field (76.9%).

GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- Blazers' guard Andre Miller led the Blazers with a team-high 26 points on 9-18 FGs. Portland has now won eleven of their last thirteen contests overall. OKC meanwhile, suffered just their second defeat in the last 10 games played at the Ford Center.
- After trailing by as many as seven points in the fourth quarter, Oklahoma City tied the score at 84 apiece with 3:54 left in regulation after an alley-oop dunk from Russell Westbrook to Serge Ibaka. Portland would hold OKC to 1-of-5 shooting the rest of the way while outscoring the Thunder 8-3 to secure the victory.
- The Thunder recorded just 16 fourth quarter points while shooting 35.7% (5-14 FGs) in the period. OKC missed all six of their three point attempts in the fourth quarter.
- Kevin Durant registered his 22nd double-double of the season with a game-high 29 points and 13 rebounds.
- In addition to his game-high four blocked shots, Serge Ibaka led all reserves with 10 points on 5-of-6 shooting. Ibaka has scored 10+ points in eight of the last sixteen Thunder contests.
- With the win, POR improves to 14-3 this season on the second night of a back-to-back. Oklahoma City now finds themselves in a three-way tie (Portland & San Antonio) for sixth place in the Western Conference standings.

OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

And the Thunder Rolls: With their 109-104 victory on Wednesday night versus the Boston Celtics, Oklahoma City owns a 22-7 (.759) record dating back to January 29th. The .759 winning percentage during this span is 4th best in the NBA. During this 29 game stretch, the Thunder is scoring better than 104 points per game on 47.5% shooting from the field. By defeating the Celtics earlier this week the Thunder recorded their 46th win, thereby doubling the team's win total from all of last season. During the past decade, only 10 teams have doubled their win total from one season to the next (Most recently: Miami Heat won 43 in 2008-09 after 15 wins in 2007-08).

That's Improvement: After finishing with a record of 23-59 (.280) a season ago, Oklahoma City has shown material improvement this year. With 74 games played during the 2009-10 season, OKC has compiled a record of 46-28 (.622) which represents a 34.2% improvement in winning percentage year-over-year. The 33.6% improvement leads the NBA this season (Memphis ranks second with a 22.1% year-over-year improvement).

March Madness: The 11 wins by the Thunder in March are the most wins in a month since the OKC franchise won 11 games in March of 2005. OKC has now posted four consecutive winning months for the first time since the 2004-05 season.

NBA's Leading Scorer...In a Deadlock: In recent days Kevin Durant and LeBron James have each taken turns leading the NBA in scoring. Heading into tonight's match-up versus the Mavericks, KD (29.66 ppg) finds himself trailing LeBron (29.73) ever so slightly in the race for the league's scoring title. If KD were to lead the league in scoring at season's end, he would become the first ever OKC franchise player to accomplish the feat. Dating back to Christmas day, Durant leads the NBA with a 30.9 point-per-game average on 48.6% field goal shooting including 38.8% (71-183) three-point shooting.

Moving up The Charts: In his third NBA season, Kevin Durant has already recorded 2,195 points through the first 74 games this year. With eight games still left to play, Durant already ranks 3rd in franchise history for most points scored in a single season. Last month, Durant reached the 2,000 point plateau with his three-point field goal at the 3:39 mark of the third quarter during the Thunder's loss to the Indiana Pacers (3/21). KD reached the 2,000 point threshold in just his 68th game of the season and in doing so he becomes one of only two NBA players to accomplish the feat at age 21 or younger. LeBron James reached the 2,000-point scored plateau in his 65th game during the 2005-06 season at the age of 21.

30 Never Looked so Good: With his game-high 37 points against Boston on Wednesday night (3/31), Kevin Durant registered his 40th 30-plus scoring game of the season. The 40 games of 30+ points are the MOST in the NBA this year. Most importantly, the Thunder is 28-12 when Durant scores 30+. With more than two weeks remaining in the regular season, Durant has already set the franchise-record for most 30-point games in a season (Spencer Haywood 35 games of 30+; 1972-1973). Earlier this year, Durant set an all-time franchise record by scoring 30+ points in SEVEN consecutive contests (12/22 – 1/2). During this two-week long run, Durant posted averages of 33.6 points on 56.8% shooting (84-148 FG's) including 45.8% shooting from behind the 3-point arc (11-24). LeBron James was the last NBA player to piece together a seven-game string of 30+ (Nov. 2007).

Russell Rules: After recording double-figure assist totals nine times during his rookie season (2008-09), Russell Westbrook tallied his 26th double-figure assist game of this season vs. the Boston Celtics on 3/31. He has now recorded double-doubles in 14 of the last 26 Thunder contests (26 double-doubles on the season). Included in that stretch, Westbrook registered his second career triple-double 2/21 at Minnesota where he finished the night with 22 points to go along with 10 rebounds and 14 assists. Westbrook, who currently ranks 7th in the NBA with 8.0 assists per game, recorded double-figure assist totals in four straight contests (12/28 – 1/2). The last OKC franchise player to record such a feat was Gary Payton who handed-out 10-plus assists in four consecutive games during the 2001-02 season (1/3/02 – 1/10/02). Oklahoma City is 19-5 this year when Westbrook records 10+ assists.

A Run for the Record-Books: In a streak that spanned 64 days, Kevin Durant became the ONLY active NBA player to score 25 or more points in 29 consecutive games. The streak which began 12/22 at LAL came to an end on 2/24 when Durant recorded a team-high 21 points in the Thunder's loss to San Antonio. During the 29-game run, the Thunder posted a record of 20-9 as KD averaged 32.4 points on 50.8% shooting including 50.0% (51-102) from behind the three-point arc. Durant becomes the first player in NBA history under the age of 22 to piece-together 29 straight games of 25+ points. Ray Allen held the previous franchise mark by recording 25-plus in ten straight games during the 2006-07 season. Michael Jordan was the last player to exceed KD's streak when he recorded 25+ points in 40 straight games during the 1986-87 season.

Feasting on the East: With their 109-104 victory over the Boston Celtics on 3/31, OKC concluded their schedule vs. Eastern Conference opponents by finishing with a 22-8 record. On the season, the Thunder "swept" EIGHT Eastern Conference opponents (Miami, Detroit, Washington, Atlanta, New York, New Jersey, Toronto and Philadelphia) while defeating 14-of-15 teams in the conference (0-2 vs. Cleveland). The 22 wins against "The East" are more than twice the Thunder road win total for all of last season. Last season, the Thunder failed to "sweep" a single Eastern Conference foe as OKC concluded the year with an 8-22 mark against "The East".

Boards are the Barometer: With the NBA schedule down to the final weeks, rebounding has proven to be a key element of the Thunder's early-season success. OKC who ranks 3rd in the NBA in rebounding, has outrebounded their opponent in 52 of 74 games this season. In those games, OKC posts a 38-14 record. Meanwhile, the Thunder is just 8-14 when they fail to outrebound their opponent. During a three-game stretch to close-out 2009 (12/23 at PHX – 12/28 at NJ), OKC outrebounded their opponent by 10 or more in each of the three straight contests. It had been four years since the OKC franchise last outrebounded their opponent by 10+ in three consecutive games (12/23/05 – 12/29/05). On the season, the Thunder is 15-1 when outrebounding their opponent by 10 or more.

Back-2-Back Sets: The Thunder recently concluded their 15th back-to-back of the season by "sweeping" the Philadelphia 76ers (3/30) and the Boston Celtics (3/31) for their fourth sweep of a B-2-B this season. At the end of 2009, the Thunder captured a "sweep" of a back-to-back match-up by defeating the Nets and Wizards on 12/28 and 12/29. It was the first "sweep" of a B-2-B by the OKC franchise since March 27th and 28th of 2007. During the teams' 15 already completed back-to-backs this season, the Thunder secured a "split" in seven of those match-ups to go along with four "sweeps". This year, the Thunder is 8-7 on the first night of a back-to-back and 7-8 on the second night. Last season, the Thunder posted an 8-28 record in their back-to-back match-ups (3-15 in first game, 5-13 in second game).

Road Warriors: With their victory over the Minnesota Timberwolves (2/21), the Thunder won five consecutive roads games for the first time since February of 2005. Earlier this season, the Thunder pieced together two separate three-game road winning streaks. As a point of reference, the OKC franchise failed to win three straight road contests in each of the last two seasons. With their win versus the Celtics at the TD Garden (3/31), OKC owns a 22-15 record away from the Ford Center. The 22 road wins exceeds the combined road win total for the past two seasons (15). The Thunder is one of TEN NBA teams to boast a winning road record this season.

Winning with D: After defeating the Celtics 109-104 earlier this week (3/31), the Thunder ranks 9th in the NBA by allowing 96.7 points per game (allowed 103.1 points per game last season). The Thunder has held their opponent to 90 points or fewer in twenty one games this season (19-2 record in such contests). Oklahoma City also ranks 4th in opponent field goal percentage as the Thunder allow their opposition to shoot 44.4%. Lastly, defense is quickly becoming the trademark during Thunder victories this season. In the 46 Thunder wins (SAC, DET, ORL, LAC, SA, MIA, WAS, UTA, MIL, PHI, GS, MEM, DET, PHX, CHA, NJ, WAS, UTA, CHI, IND, NY, MIA, ATL, MIN, DEN, GS, ATL, NO, GS, POR, DAL, NY, MIN, TOR, SAC, LAC, SAC, NO, NJ, UTA, TOR, HOU, LAL, PHI and BOS), OKC is allowing only 93.9 points per game on 43.4% shooting.

New and Improved: In his second NBA season, Thunder guard Russell Westbrook has shown an improved all-around game. During his first 74 contests, Westbrook is averaging 16.2 points, 8.0 assists and 4.9 rebounds in 34.3 minutes per game. Only a select number of NBA players have maintained such averages throughout the course of an entire season. Below is a list of those second-year players to average 16-plus points, 6-plus assists and 4-plus rebounds during their sophomore NBA seasons.

Filling up the Ford: The Thunder began the 2009-10 season right where they left off... with another sellout. Those that made up the capacity crowd of 18,203 on opening night (10/28/09) in Oklahoma City were greeted with a new and improved Ford Center. As part of a taxpayer funded initiative passed in March 2008, numerous arena improvements were recently completed. The Ford Center now boasts a state-of-the art scoreboard, new terrace suites and a courtside club to go along with a new and improved Thunder locker room. Last season, fans from near and far flocked to Oklahoma City to witness Thunder basketball. This season, the Thunder has posted 24 sellouts while drawing an average crowd of 17,972 representing 98.7% capacity. Most recently, OKC has sold-out seven straight contests and 13 of the last 16 games dating back to 1/27. During the Thunder's inaugural season in OKC (2008-09), the Ford Center recorded 18 sellouts (19,136) including eight consecutive to end the season. In 41 home games, the Thunder's average attendance topped the 18,700 mark (11th best in the NBA), accounting for an average capacity of nearly 98.0%.

Friendly February: With seven straight wins to open the month of February, the Oklahoma City Thunder extended their longest winning streak (nine games) since 2004. By defeating the Toronto Raptors 119-99 on 2/28, OKC finished the month of February with a 9-2 mark (.818). The 81.8% winning percentage is the highest in a given month (minimum 10 games) for the franchise since January 1997 (.846). The 9-2 record proved enough to win Thunder head coach Scott Brooks NBA Coach of the Month honors. In his first full-season as Thunder head-coach, Brooks wins the award for the first time in his career.

Youth Movement: As of February 24, the Oklahoma City Thunder is the youngest team in the NBA with an average age of 24 years and 338 days (Memphis 2nd youngest; 24 years, 364 days). Additionally, as of opening night (10/28), the OKC starting lineup (Durant, Green, Krstic, Sefolosa and Westbrook) was the youngest in the league with an average age of 23 years and 179 days. For a matter of comparison, the age of the average NBA roster is 26 years and 329 days and the oldest team in the league entering the 2009-10 season was the San Antonio Spurs with an average age of 29 years and 73 days (as of opening night). There are currently nine players on the Thunder roster age 23 or younger.

Worth Noting: During the Thunder's 113-107 victory over the Sacramento Kings on 3/2, Kevin Durant (39 points/10 rebounds) and Russell Westbrook (30 points/13 assists) finished with their 19th and 17th double-doubles of the year, respectively. This marks the first time in NBA history that two teammates, each age 21 or younger, each had a 30/10 game.

All Good Things Must Come to an End: With their loss to the Phoenix Suns on 2/23, the Thunder fell victim to a loss for the first time in nearly a month (1/27 vs. Chicago). The Thunder loss snapped a run of nine straight Oklahoma City victories. The nine consecutive wins is the longest streak for the OKC franchise since the team won nine games in a row after losing its season opener to begin the 2004-05 season (11/5/04 – 11/19/04). Additionally, the nine-game streak at the time was the longest win streak in the NBA. During the nine game undefeated stretch, the Thunder shot 47.5% from the floor while outscoring the opposition by a 104.9 to 96.6 margin.

All-Star Recap: Kevin Durant made his inaugural NBA All-Star debut earlier this season (2/14) at Cowboy Stadium in front of a record crowd of 108,713 on hand to witness a 141-139 Eastern Conference victory. Durant came off the "West" bench to see 20 minutes of action during which time he knocked-down half of his 14 shots en route to 15 points and five rebounds. On Saturday night (2/13), Durant captured his second H-O-R-S-E victory as he eliminated Boston's Rajon Rondo and Sacramento's Omri Casspi. Meanwhile, Thunder rookie James Harden and second-year guard Russell Westbrook competed in the T-Mobile Rookie-Sophomore Challenge and Youth Jam held at the American Airlines Center on Friday night (2/12). Westbrook led all scorers with 40 points on 18-29 shooting in 32 minutes of action. James Harden helped lead the rookies to victory as he posted 22 points (9-14 FGs) in just 23 minutes of action. Westbrook was also added as a last-minute replacement for Derrick Rose in the NBA Skills Competition.

45-4-KD: In the Thunder's outing versus Golden State (1/31), Kevin Durant posted his 14th double-double of the year by recording a season-high 45 points to go along with 11 rebounds. By converting 16-of-21 field goals, KD becomes just the second player in franchise history to record 45+ points on better than 75.0% shooting (Spencer Haywood on 1/7/72; 48 pts on 21-28 FGs). Shaquille O'Neal was the last NBA player to accomplish such a feat {2/27/09 TOR @ PHX (48 pts on 21-28 FGs)}.

Talking Turnovers: During OKC's game at Milwaukee (1/2), Thunder guard Russell Westbrook handed-out 13 assists without committing a single turnover. With ZERO turnovers against the Bucks, he recorded the most assists (13) without a turnover (in franchise history) since April 8, 2001 (Gary Payton; 15 assists, 0 TO's). Additionally, it is the most assists without a turnover in the NBA in nearly a year (Chris Paul 15 assists, zero turnovers; 1/6/09). With his zero-turnover performance in the Thunder's recent win vs. NY (1/11), Westbrook has failed to commit a single turnover in six games this season (5-1 OKC record). As a team, the Oklahoma City Thunder committed 14 or fewer turnovers in EIGHT consecutive games to close 2009 (12/16 – 12/29). On the year, OKC is 29-13 when committing 15 or fewer turnovers.

Select Company: If Kevin Durant were to maintain his current 29-plus scoring clip throughout the remainder of the season, he would find himself amongst some select NBA company. Only LeBron James has posted a higher scoring total than Durant at age 21 or younger. To the right is a list of other notable scoring totals for players age 21 or younger.

Technically Speaking: With 14 (individual) technical fouls called through the first 74 games of the 2009-10 season, the Thunder continue their run of being one of the fewest "T'd-Up" teams in the league. During the 2008-09 season, 11 individual technicals (excludes defensive technicals) were whistled on Thunder players and coaches. This total was the fewest awarded to any NBA team during the season. In addition, the Thunder committed 31 total technical fouls (includes individual and defensive 3-second technicals) which tied for the fewest in the NBA (San Antonio). This total also represents the fewest "T's" committed in the NBA since the 1997-98 season (Golden State; 22).

Close, but... The Oklahoma City Thunder lost four games played between 1/13 – 1/23 (CLE, MEM, DAL and SA) by a combined FIVE points. The aggregate five point deficit is the smallest combined margin of defeat for four consecutive losses in franchise history. It has been more than a decade since another NBA team last experienced four straight losses by a total of just five points (Indiana Pacers; 3/30/99 – 4/10/99).

Another Thunder POW: Russell Westbrook earned his first Player of the Week award for 2009-10 it was announced earlier this month by the NBA. Westbrook won the award for games played February 1-7. During the seven day span Westbrook helped lead Oklahoma City to a 3-0 week, including two wins on the road (GS, NO) while averaging 19.7 points, 9.7 assists, 8.0 rebounds and 3.3 steals. Earlier this season, Thunder forward Kevin Durant was twice named NBA Player of the Week (January 25-31 and December 28 through January 3).

Perfection from the Stripe: During OKC's loss to the Sacramento Kings (11/10), Kevin Durant recorded a game-high 37 points in large part due to his efficiency from the charity stripe. Durant set a franchise record by converting 18 made free throws without a miss (also a NBA season-high). Setting all-time franchise records from the free throw line is not unfamiliar to Durant. Last season versus the Los Angeles Clippers (1/23/09), KD converted 24 made free throws (on 26 attempts) en route to a 46-point performance at STAPLES Center. Durant's 24 made free throws set a Thunder franchise record. In addition, Durant set a NBA season-high for most FT's made during the 2008-09 season. In doing so, Durant became one of only four players over the last 20 years to convert 24+ FT's in a single game (MR; LeBron James: 24-of-28 on 3/12/06).

Harden's Greatest Hits: In the Thunder match-ups vs. Orlando (11/18) and Washington (11/20), Harden connected on 10-of-13 3-point field goals including seven consecutive makes during this two-game stretch. The seven consecutive makes ties a rookie record for the most consecutive 3-pointers converted by a first-year player since Michael Dickerson made eight straight for the Houston Rockets (5/4/99-5/5/99). His six 3-point makes at Orlando (11/18) tied a rookie franchise record (Rich Frahm; 12/20/03).

Century Mark: On December 2nd versus the Philadelphia 76ers, Thunder guard Russell Westbrook notched his 100th career game in memorable fashion. In 34 minutes played vs. Philly, Westbrook recorded a season-high 15 assists, marking the 14th time in his career in which he has reached double-figure assist totals. By posting 11 double-doubles (points and assists) through his first 100 career contests, Westbrook becomes one-of-twelve active players to have accomplished the feat. He joins the likes of Jason Kidd, Chris Paul, Allen Iverson and Deron Williams by posting 11-plus double-doubles comprised of points and assists through his first 100 career games played.
