### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- Kevin Durant recorded 18 (6-7 FG's) of his season-high 40 points in the third quarter. It was Durant's 5<sup>th</sup> 40-plus scoring game of his career. On the night, Durant converted 14-of-25 FG's (56.0%). Meanwhile, the rest of the Thunder players connected on 19-of-60 FG's (31.6%).
- OKC outrebounded LAC 48-42 on the night (48 rebounds is OKC season-high). In the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter however, Los Angeles grabbed five offensive rebounds while outrebounding OKC 13-7 in the final period.
- The game featured 25 lead changes and 13 ties. LAC led by as many as 13 points early in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter and the Thunder never led by more than three at any point during the game.
- Westbrook (17 points/9 rebounds/7 assists) connected on a 16 foot jump-shot with 1:59 remaining to put OKC ahead 93-92. LAC would close the game on a 9-0 run to secure the eight point victory.
- Chris Kaman and Baron Davis combined to score 49 points on 19-of-35 shooting (54.3%).
- OKC was outscored 26-17 in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter. The 26 points surrendered by OKC in the period is the most 4<sup>th</sup> quarter points allowed by the Thunder this season.

### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- After trailing by double-figures in the second quarter, OKC responded in the second half by outscoring SA 55-45 thanks to 55.6% Thunder shooting. The 55 second half points represents a season-high for OKC.
- Russell Westbrook (19 points, 11 assists) posted his fourth double-double of the season while Jeff Green recorded 21 points and 10 rebounds for his second double-double of the 2009-10 season. Westbrook finished with 14 (5-8 FG's) of his 19 points in the second half. His driving layup with 46 second left in regulation gave OKC a 96-91 advantage. OKC is 4-0 when Westbrook records 10+ assists.
- The game featured 13 lead changes and 7 ties. OKC outrebounded SA by a slight 40-38 margin. Thunder is 5-1 this season when outrebounding their opponent.
- Thabo Sefolosha matched a season-high with four steals while the Thunder team set a season-high with 10 blocked shots.
- Thunder's starters outscored Spurs' starters 83-52. Meanwhile, OKC outscored SA 20-4 on second chance point opportunities.
- Dating back to last season, OKC has won three of the last five match-ups versus SA.

### GAME HIGHLIGHTS:

- OKC overcame a nine-point second half deficit as the Thunder held the Clippers to 10 4<sup>th</sup> quarter points and 22.2% shooting (8-36 FG's) in the second half. The 10 4<sup>th</sup> quarter points by LAC is the fewest allowed by the OKC franchise since April 4, 2007 (6 pts. at NO).
- Kevin Durant finished with a game-high 30 points and a team-high 10 rebounds for his third double-double of the season. His 15-foot jump shot with 38.9 seconds left in regulation gave OKC a 81-79 lead.
- The Thunder led in all "hustle-point" categories. OKC led the Clippers in rebounding (46-43), points in the paint (40-32), second chance points (16-14) and fast break points (7-4). In addition, the Thunder's reserves outscored the Clipper's bench 26-11.
- After trailing 56-65 with 3:53 remaining in the third quarter, OKC used a 22-6 run to pull ahead 78-71 on a Jeff Green lay-up with 5:42 remaining in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter.
- Thunder rookie Serge Ibaka recorded his first career field goal while fellow OKC rookie James Harden finished with a team-high eight assists to go along with seven points and five rebounds.
- OKC held LAC to an opponent season-low 35.9% (28-78 FG's) shooting including 15.8% shooting (3-19 FG's) in the fourth quarter.

## OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER NOTES

**Winning with D:** Despite a 101-93 loss to the Los Angeles Clippers on Sunday night, the Thunder still ranks 5<sup>th</sup> in the NBA by allowing just 91.4 points per game. Through the end of regulation (excluding overtime), the Thunder has held their opponent to 90 points or fewer in six-of-ten games this season. Oklahoma City also ranks in the top-10 in opponent field goal percentage by allowing their opposition to shoot 43.8%. Defense is quickly become the trademark during Thunder victories this season. In the five Thunder wins (SAC, DET, ORL, LAC and SA), OKC is allowing only 84.6 points per game on 39.6% shooting.

**Defending When it Matters:** During the Thunder's 83-79 victory over the Los Angeles Clippers (11/11) at STAPLES Center, OKC held the Clippers to just 10 4<sup>th</sup> quarter points on 15.8% shooting (3-19 FG's). The 10 points surrendered in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter is the fewest allowed since the 2006-07 season when the OKC franchise held the New Orleans Hornets to an all-time franchise low six 4<sup>th</sup> quarter points. Through the first 10 games of the season, the Thunder is limiting their opponents to 20.5 points during the final 12 minutes of regulation (2<sup>nd</sup> lowest in NBA). In the five Thunder wins, OKC opponents are scoring an average of just 19.0 4<sup>th</sup> quarter points on 29.5% shooting.

**New and Improved:** Through the first three weeks of the NBA season, Thunder second-year guard Russell Westbrook has shown an improved all-around game. During his first ten contests, Westbrook is averaging 15.6 points, 7.6 assists and 5.3 rebounds in 34.2 minutes per game. Only a select number of NBA players have maintained such averages throughout the course of an entire season. Below is a list of those second-year players to average 16-plus points, 6-plus assists and 4-plus rebounds during their sophomore NBA seasons.

**Early Returns:** After recording double-figure assist totals nine times during his rookie season (2008-09), Russell Westbrook has already posted four 10-plus assist performances through his the first 10 games this season. Westbrook, who currently ranks T-6<sup>th</sup> in the NBA with 7.6 assists per game, has increased his assist total after averaging 5.2 apg during his rookie season. Oklahoma City is 4-0 this year when Westbrook records 10+ assists. Deron Williams of the Utah Jazz was the last second year player to increase his assist total by a greater margin than Westbrook. After averaging 4.5 assists during his rookie season (2005-06), Williams went onto average 9.3 assists during his second NBA season.

**Perfection from the Stripe:** In last Tuesday's loss to the Sacramento Kings, Kevin Durant recorded a game-high 37 points in large part due to his efficiency from the charity stripe. Durant set a franchise record by converting 18 made free throws without a miss. Setting all-time franchise records from the free throw line is not unfamiliar to Durant. Last season versus the Los Angeles Clippers (1/23/09), KD converted 24 made free throws (on 26 attempts) en route to a 46-point performance at STAPLES Center. Durant's 24 made free throws set a Thunder franchise record. In addition, Durant set a NBA season-high for most FT's made during the 2008-09 season. In doing so, Durant became one of only four players over the last 20 years to convert 24+ FT's in a single game (MR; LeBron James: 24-of-28 on 3/12/06).

**First Impressions:** With their 102-89 victory over the Sacramento Kings on October 28<sup>th</sup>, the OKC franchise secured their first opening night victory since 2003 when they defeated the Los Angeles Clippers 109-100 in Saitama, Japan. During the Thunder's wire-to-wire win at the Ford Center, Russell Westbrook set a career-high with 13 assists to go along with 14 points and seven rebounds. With his 13 assists, Westbrook single-handily matched the entire assist total for the entire Kings team. The last time an OKC franchise player matched the entire opposing team's assist total occurred in 2006 when Luke Ridnour handed-out 13 assists in a 110-106 defeat vs. the Portland Trail Blazers. With their most recent win versus San Antonio (11/14), the Thunder enters tonight's contest with a record of 5-5. Last season, the Thunder did not record their 6<sup>th</sup> victory until January 10<sup>th</sup> (at CHI).

**Lots of Magic vs. Orlando:** During the Thunder's 102-74 victory over the Orlando Magic last Sunday night, OKC held ORL to 30 second half points on 29.4% field goal shooting (10-34 FG's). The 28-point margin of victory represents the largest Thunder win in Ford Center history. In knocking-off last season's Eastern Conference Champions, the Thunder shot a season-high 57.1% while handing-out a season-best 27 assists. Meanwhile, Orlando shot a season-worst 36.8% while converting a season-low 25 made field goals. Orlando was held to fewer than 75 points for just the third time in the last three-plus seasons. With the victory, the Thunder notched their third win of the year. It was not until December 19<sup>th</sup> of last season (vs. TOR) before the Thunder would claim their third win.

**Youth Movement:** The Thunder enters the 2009-10 season as the second youngest team in the NBA with an average age of 25 years and 130 days (as of opening night). They trail only the Memphis Grizzlies who boast an average age of 25 years and 92 days. Additionally, the OKC opening night (10/28) starting lineup (Durant, Green, Krstic, Sefolosha and Westbrook) was the youngest in the league with an average age of 23 years and 179 days. For a matter of comparison, the age of the average NBA roster is 26 years and 329 days and the oldest team in the league entering the 2009-10 season was the San Antonio Spurs with an average age of 29 years and 73 days. There are currently eight players on the Thunder roster age 23 or younger.

**Let the Balloting Begin:** Thunder forward Kevin Durant, forward Jeff Green and guard Russell Westbrook all appeared on the 2010 NBA All-Star Ballot which was unveiled last week during a special tip-off event in Dallas, the Official Host City of NBA All-Star Weekend 2010. Voting will take place at all Thunder home contests at the Ford Center beginning this Sunday, November 15 vs. L.A. Clippers and all the way through Oklahoma City's match-up with Indiana on January 9<sup>th</sup>. The Thunder trio can also be voted-in via online balloting at [thunder.nba.com](http://thunder.nba.com) which begins immediately and continues on through January 18. The 2010 NBA All-Star Game will be played at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, Texas, before an expected crowd of more than 80,000 – the largest group ever to witness a live basketball game, on Sunday, Feb. 14, 2010.

**Technically Speaking:** With no individual technical fouls called through the first 10 games of the 2009-10 season, the Thunder continue their run of being one of the fewest "T'd-Up" teams in the league. During the 2008-09 season, 11 individual technicals (excludes defensive technicals) were whistled on Thunder players and coaches. This total was the fewest awarded to any NBA team during the season. In addition, the Thunder committed 31 total technical fouls (includes individual and defensive 3-second technicals) which tied for the fewest in the NBA (San Antonio). This total also represents the fewest "T's" committed in the NBA since the 1997-98 season (Golden State; 22).

**What Lazy Days of Summer?:** The Thunder was the only NBA team to participate in multiple summer leagues this past off-season. Seven players currently on the Thunder roster saw action in the Orlando Pro Summer League (July 5-10) and the NBA Summer League in Las Vegas (July 10-19). Thunder second-year guard Russell Westbrook and OKC Rookie James Harden were both named to the 2009 Orlando Pro All-Summer League First-Team. In addition, Thunder forward D.J. White received second-team honors for his performance in Orlando. In four Orlando Summer League contests Westbrook posted averages of 22.3 points (.519 FG%), 3.5 rebounds and 7.8 assists in 32.3 minutes per game. Harden, the No. 3 overall selection in this past summer's NBA draft participated in a total of nine summer league contests and recorded averages of 14.7 points (.506 FG%), 3.3 rebounds and 2.4 assists in 27.9 minutes per game.

**Country First:** The OKC trio of Kevin Durant, Jeff Green and Russell Westbrook were all invited to participate in the 2009 USA Basketball Men's National Team mini-camp held in Las Vegas this past July. In preparation for the 2010 World Championships and the 2012 Olympic Games in London, USA basketball hosted the three-day event which included an intra-squad Blue vs. White scrimmage on the final day. Thunder Head Athletic Trainer, Joe Sharpe was also invited to participate in the Team USA event.

**Summer Oversees:** Both Nenad Krstic (Serbia) and Thabo Sefolosha (Switzerland) spent the summer months representing their counties as they competed in the 2009 EuroBasket Championships held in Poland. While Sefolosha and Switzerland participated in the Division B bracket, Krstic helped lead the Serbia team to the Championship Game vs. Spain in the upper Division A bracket. In nine EuroBasket contests, Krstic posted averages of 13.4 points, 4.8 rebounds and 1.6 assists in 23.4 minutes per game. Meanwhile, Sefolosha played in four games for the Swiss team and compiled averages of 15.8 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.3 assists in 37.3 minutes per contest.

**Filling up the Ford:** The Thunder began the 2009-10 season right where they left off... with another sellout. Those that made up the capacity crowd of 18,203 on opening night (10/28) in Oklahoma City were greeted with a new and improved Ford Center. As part of a taxpayer funded initiative passed in March 2008, numerous arena improvements were recently completed. The Ford Center now boasts a state-of-the art scoreboard, new terrace suites and a courtside club to go along with a new and improved Thunder locker room. Last season, fans from near and far flocked to Oklahoma City to witness Thunder basketball. During the Thunder's inaugural season in OKC, the Ford Center recorded 18 sellouts (19,136) including eight consecutive to end the season. In 41 home games, the Thunder's average attendance topped the 18,700 mark (11<sup>th</sup> best in the NBA), accounting for an average capacity of nearly 98.0%. This season, the Thunder has sold-out three of their first five home contests.

**Race to 3,000... and Beyond:** During the Thunder game in Phoenix on February 20<sup>th</sup> of last season, Kevin Durant etched his name into the NBA record books by becoming the second youngest player (behind only LeBron James) to record 3,000 points in league history. With his 35 points versus the Suns, Durant reached the 3,000-point plateau in only 134 games. Durant will look to surpass the 5,000 point mark during the 2009-10 NBA as he currently sits with 3,776 career points scored.

**Sophomore Studs:** At the end of last season, second year players Kevin Durant and Jeff Green combined to average 41.8 points per game. The last pair of second year teammates to average a higher total was Allen Iverson and Jerry Stackhouse for the Philadelphia 76ers who more than a decade ago combined to average 44.2 points per game during the 1996-97 season.

**Durant Dazzles:** Through his first two NBA seasons, Kevin Durant has already proven that he is one of the elite scorers in the game. Durant, the NBA's 6<sup>th</sup> leading scorer last season, averaged 25.3 points in just his second season removed from the University of Texas. He became the NBA's 5<sup>th</sup> second-year player in the last 20 years to average better than 25 points per game.

**Not "Two" Shabby:** After two seasons in the NBA, Kevin Durant boasts a 22.7 scoring average, the fifth highest career average for any second year player in the modern era (dating back to 1989). Only Shaquille O'Neal (26.4), David Robinson (25.0), LeBron James (24.1) and Vince Carter (22.9) posted higher career scoring averages after their first two NBA seasons.

**Young Guns:** During the 2008-09 season, the Thunder registered a majority of their scoring from either first or second year players. In fact, OKC rookies and second year players combined to score 4,780 of the 7,952 total Thunder points. This total represents 60.1% of the OKC points scored, the highest percent of any team in the NBA during the 2008-09 season. The last team with a higher percentage of points coming from rookies and second year players occurred during the 1997-98 season when the Boston Celtics received 68.7% of their scoring from a young team which included the likes of Antoine Walker, Ron Mercer, and Walter McCarty.

**Russell Rules:** Last season, Russell was one of just 15 players and the lone rookie to average at least 15 points, four rebounds and four assists. On March 2<sup>nd</sup> versus Dallas, he became the first rookie to record a triple double since Chris Paul accomplished the feat during the 2005-06 season. Lastly, by converting 20 made free-throws February 1<sup>st</sup> at Sacramento, Westbrook became just the 3<sup>rd</sup> rookie in NBA history to score 20 FT's in a single game.

**KD En Fuego:** Last year, prior to his injury 2/27 at Dallas, Kevin Durant found himself on a red-hot scoring tear seldom witnessed by a second year NBA player. In the 17 games prior to his injury (1/16 vs. DET through 2/24 vs. LAL), Durant posted a scoring average of 32.3 points per game. During this five-week long span, Durant led the NBA in scoring by a 2.4 point per game margin (LeBron James; 29.9 ppg). To highlight the rarity of such a blistering stretch, it has been 35 years since a second year player last averaged 32+ points across a 17-game span (Bob McAdoo; 34.7 ppg during the 1974 season).
